

**SOUTH HAVEN CHARTER TOWNSHIP  
MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING  
WEDNESDAY, APRIL 13, 2022**

**Present:** Stein, Wiatrowski, Kiry, Bertorelli, Lewandowski, DeGrandchamp and Fisher

**Absent:** None

**Meeting was called to order** by Supervisor Stein at 7:30 p.m.

**March 9, 2022** minutes were accepted as presented.

**Correspondence** was received from Mark Hernes.

**Jim Horan** a resident was in attendance with concerns about Hood Outdoor conducting an event. Supervisor Stein said it had already been dealt with. George Lucas and Kevin Whiteford were in attendance introducing themselves as candidates for State Representatives.

**Zach Zenreich**, a SHAES representative, gave a report. He reported that SHAES is 60 calls ahead of where they were last year at this time.

**Motion by DeGrandchamp**, supported by Wiatrowski, to accept the Agenda as presented. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

**Motion by Kiry**, supported by Lewandowski to approve the bid from DeBest for improvements at Deerlick in the amount of \$24,906.00. All voted in favor by roll call vote. Motion carried.

**Motion by Kiry**, supported by Fisher, to approve the Revocable License Agreement presented by our attorney for the property to the north of Deerlick Park dealing with their illegally placed boulders with a change to paragraph 3 on page 4 so that it states the Owner must 'seek' permission every time they wish to access the boulders for maintenance work using the township property to do so and they must provide a performance bond before they start the work. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

**Supervisor Stein** stated that he would ask the township attorney to send a letter to the Deerlick Park south neighbors in response to their claims of where the boundary exists and placement of signs.

**Supervisor Stein** attended a meeting regarding the High-Speed Internet study conducted by the County. He stated that many communities are committing their ARPA funds to assist in expanding internet in their communities.

**Motion by Stein**, supported by Bertorelli, to accept, with regrets, Scott Raue's resignation from the Planning Commission. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

**Motion by Kiry**, supported by Wiatrowski, to approve Resolution 22-07 Approval of Ballot Language for Senior Services Millage. All voted in favor by roll call vote. Motion carried.

**Discussion was held** regarding short term rental ordinances. There was consensus that the Township should start a study and review surrounding communities for examples to come up with a plan. The Planning Commission and Zoning Department will most likely be involved.

**There was consensus** from the Board members to look at other communities in the County that have drafted ordinances to allow ORV and Golf Carts on the roads in their communities and review these documents.

**Reports** from various committees and authorities were received. W.C. Askew was in attendance for the Road Commission and Jean Stein reported for the library.

**Motion by Fisher**, supported by Kiry, to approve payment of anticipated bills in the amount of \$58,398.58. All voted in favor by roll call vote. Motion carried.
